



## **Applied Law (BTEC Nationals Level 3 Extended Certificate)**

### **What will the course involve?**

There are three mandatory units and one optional unit that you will study. These units cover various topics which include:

- Dispute Solving in Civil Law
- Investigating Aspects of Criminal Law and the Legal System
- Applying Law

Optional topics that can be studied include; Aspects of Family Law, Consumer Law, Contract Law and Aspects of Tort.

### **How will I be assessed?**

Students will sit one exam in the first year and complete one course work portfolio. During the second-year students will sit a further exam unit and complete a second portfolio unit.

In both exams students are provided with the opportunity to sit the exam units twice within the two years of study.

### **What skills will I develop?**

This course brings together knowledge and understanding with practical and technical skills. It includes opportunity to develop research, communication, presentation, decision-making and critical-thinking skills all of which are valued in both higher education and employment in the legal sector.

### **Where can the study of Applied Law lead?**

The qualification allows learners to develop the wide-ranging knowledge; understanding and skills required for direct progression into a broad range of roles within the industry they are going to be a part of.

The BTEC National in Applied Law provides an excellent introduction to law giving students a grounding to progress on to higher education and employment.
