

Psychology (A Level)

What will the course involve?

We will be taking a scientific journey to discover theories and research that have been carried out to understand human behaviour and thinking. This will include an understanding of scientific methods, and a good amount of neuroscience and human biology. [Understanding the structure and biology of the brain, nervous and endocrine systems] This is an exciting course that will open your mind to a new way of looking at your friends, family, yourself and the world.

How will I be assessed?

In line with all other science A levels:

3 two hour examinations in May /June of Year 2 (NO COURSEWORK)

What skills will I develop?

- An understanding of scientific method
- How to carry out scientific research studies [required in many undergraduate degrees]
- Statistical analysis of data, presentation of data [descriptive and inferential]
- High level of evaluative skills
- Ability to write in a concise scientific way

Where can the study of Psychology lead?

- Past Psychology students at ABS have gone on to study a wide variety of degrees, often at Russel Group universities: Accountancy; Biology, English Literature, Forensic Science, Initial teacher training, Law, Medicine {Psychology is accepted for Medicine with Chemistry and Biology A levels}, Psychology (including Applied and Clinical)
- There are many so careers open to you, in fact there are no degrees or areas of work or study where the knowledge and skills you gain at Psychology A level would not be beneficial!
